The final workshop was debate and critical thinking skills with philosophers from Edinburgh University.


#### **Christmas Concert and Exhibition**

## Flu/Cold advice

## Key advice for parents and carers

In the home the risk of catching or spreading flu/cold like illness can be reduced by:

- Regular hand washing with liquid soap and running water
- Covering nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing
- Using a disposable paper tissue, disposed of immediately after use.
- You can teach your child to sneeze into the 'crook' of their arm rather than their hands, if they don't have a tissue. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=mQINuSTP1jl
- Good general cleaning of surface that everyone touches often e.g. TV remote, light switches, door handles, toilet flushes and tap heads.

Congratulations and good luck to Daniel Lyons [3D07] and Niamh McGregor [3C10] who are travelling to Venice to represent Scotland and their Karate Club at the World Karate Federation Youth League (the WKF K1), this is the highest possible level of international competition for Youth Karate. This is a massive competition with over 3000 entries over the 3 days of the tournament.

Daniel's category is the Cadet (14-15 years) -52kg, which has 146 athletes from 37 different countries - a big challenge for Daniel as he is new to this age group at world level - but a fantastic opportunity to compete against the best in the world.
