Jobs of the Future Conference

This is a real opportunity to understand what employers are looking for in young people and contribute to how the school can help prepare them for their next steps.

The key aims for the evening include:

- Increasing the understanding of the critical skills that will support rewarding careers
- Increasing understanding of the range of occupations and growth areas to support career development and economic growth
- Provide a chance to ask questions about myths and misconceptions about post school options
- Encourage more people to make well informed career choices based on the routes open to them and the growth areas in jobs of the future
- A chance for pupils, parents, employers and teachers to meet and discuss issues around education, training and employability

This event will take place on 30 January (6:30-8:30) and will coincide with Skills Development Scotland (SDS) and the Developing Young Workforce team delivery of *Scotland's Biggest Parent Event*. Places at this exciting event will be limited as we want to ensure there is plenty of engagement between all the participants.
