Following discussions with the Parent Council regarding how we communicate homework to parents and carers on a regular basis, we

are currently looking at how we might use Class Charts to help us facilitate this. From now until the end of this term, the Modern Languages department will be trialling the use of Class Charts for sharing homework tasks for all young people studying a language in S1-6 and their parents/carers. This will include reminders of upcoming Talking and Writing assessments for both French and Spanish.
